[fn. p. 11, affidavit dated March 6, 1846, given by Henry Bond of Gates County in which he states that John Fanny and his wife Ann lived on his (Bond's) father's land right up to the time of Ann's death in 1845; that John had the reputation of having been a continental soldier in the Revolution and that he thinks John died about 1810.]

[Nathan Ward and James Williams, Sr., of Gates County, NC, also gave an affidavit as to the reputation in the neighborhood of John Fanny having served in the Revolution.]

I William Hill Secretary of State and for the State of North Carolina, do hereby certify that it appears from the musterrolls of the Continental line of this State, that John Fanny a Corporal in Captain Raiford's Company of the 10th Regiment entered the service on the 19th May 1781 for 12 months and that he was transferred to the South Carolina line on the ___ day of September 1781.

Given under my hand this 2nd day of January 1841.
